A Word on the IAJFL 2023 Conference

In life, there are three things that are certain-death, taxes, and explosions of energy in rooms full of 65 Jewish professionals and lay leaders.

For three action packed days in October 2023, the IAJFL Conference in Las Vegas took the latter to the limit. While the result was a rousing success, I wanted to share a few thoughts on what it was like to host the conference and see it all come together.

It was an honor to be selected as the host city for the conference. Our HFL program is one that is smaller and relatively new. This was a unique opportunity for us to deepen our connection with the IAJFL and all of the participating agencies. What we didn't know, however, was just how powerful the experience was for our own brand awareness and growth of our program.

When one comes to Vegas, there is typically a 4.5 mile strip of land that visitors don't get the chance to leave. Our committee realized that Las Vegas probably isn't one of the cities that would pop into your mind when you think about thriving Jewish Communities, but it should be. We made the decision to take this Jewish conference away from the hustle and bustle of the strip and highlight the beauty of our Jewish campuses and local businesses. The synagogues and schools we visited gained a deeper understanding of the scope of our program- we are now receiving more referrals from them than ever. Of course, our people are more engaged than ever. Over half of our HFL Committee attended and are now more prideful and passionate about our work. Plus, as we are a Federation agency- each and every one of our staff had an opportunity to come to the conference and hear the stories, learn about the program and its challenges. For me, personally, I went into the conference as one of the newest staff members affiliated with IAJFL, and I left feeling like a veteran.
